Key highlights:

Canon

This month, our Year 10 GCSE photography class and a selection of Year 9 students had the opportunity to take part in an all day photography workshop with Canon.

Who are Canon?


Canon are a manufacturing corporation specializing in optical, photographic and industrial products, such as lenses, cameras, medical equipment, scanners, printers.

What was the workshop about?

The workshop theme was Biodiversity and how it affects our planet and environment. The main task of the workshop was for the students to create a photographic story around the theme of Biodiversity. Canon provide students with industry standard cameras, lenses and printer to produce their photographic work, with students having tutorials and ultimately creating a series of images using a variety of photographic techniques such as macro photography and the results were amazing! Each group selected their best image and wrote a narrative describing the image with a focus on Biodiversity which they presented to their peers. Students were given a printed image of their Final and Best photo as well as a certificate and goody bag!
